Structure of USED

- Administrations change but majority of USED staffing does not
- Appointed vs Career staff
- Main DESE points of contact are not appointed staff and this helps to maintain some continuity

Interaction with DESE – data submission

- USED requires a large volume of data be submitted annually
- EdFacts is the federal data repository of information shared with USED
- Over 100 data files shared annually at the state, district, and school levels
 - Enrollment (totals, student groups)
 - Outcomes (assessment, English proficiency, graduation rates)
 - Accountability designations
 - Federal expenditures
- IMPORTANT: no personally identifiable information is shared with USED

Interaction with DESE - monitoring

- In exchange for federal funding, the USED periodically monitors DESE's work (not unlike what DESE does with districts)
 - Programs special education, English learner programs, Title I etc.
 - Fiscal monitoring are systems in place to monitor federal spending
 - Data required data publicly available
- Federal laws and regulations have a LOT of requirements, and they are fair game for compliance

Interaction with DESE – program approvals

- DESE offices receiving federal funds are often required to submit plans guiding their work
- Examples of approval of mechanisms used by DESE
 - Assessment tools
 - District and school accountability system
