Settled in 1710, East Granby encompasses 17.4 square miles and is home to about 5,300 residents. This bucolic town, located 13 miles north of Hartford and just west of Bradley International Airport, is two hours from New York and Boston. The town boasts parks and open space (Cowles Park, East Granby Farms, Tariffville Gorge, the Pedestrian Greenway, and the Metacomet Trail), with a number of excellent museums and colleges nearby. Though 30 percent is classified as agricultural, the town has a strong manufacturing base around Bradley. Residents are proud of the town's rural setting and amenities and consider it a great place to live and raise a family. East Granby's small size is key to its great community spirit.
